
Space... room of our own...the final frontier

As a result of a question to Ask-the-Meta-Mentor (<http://advance.unm.edu/meta-mentor/>), we're talking with the University Leadership about whether or not it is possible to re-align the UNM and APS Spring breaks. The Spring Breaks were aligned for a couple of years and then returned to being at different times when APS started PARCC testing. We'll be meeting with university leaders for further discussions after next year's budget is developed. We'll keep you informed.
